## Program/Site Status

- Staffing/Site Coordinators
  - -Amanda Horwitz has resigned from C<sup>2</sup> Pipeline, she is now an Advisor for Pre-Med undergraduates. Sandy Friedli is now the C<sup>2</sup> Pipeline Program Specialist. She will be handling curriculum, supervising the STEM Center, teacher professional development, and science classes. LeTrell Henley is now the Site Coordinator at Michigan Collegiate High School, formerly he was the Assistant Site Coordinator at Clintondale High School. Don Neal and Tansi Leake will be taking over much of the summer programming responsibilities.
- STEM Center
  - -Will be adding a hydroponics room
- Enrollment Demographics
  - -1097 Total students served. 50/50 split of male and female participants. Numbers are even grade wise across the board. Approximately 800 students served are free or reduced lunch.  $C^2$  Pipeline has been a presence over time in the schools served and it is showing in undergraduate admissions.

## Program

- New curriculum Skills to Pay the Bills (Soft Skills) and Basic Photography without
  Darkroom Access accepted as new enrichments. First Aid/CPR curriculum to be added,
  also. Will probably train 6 to 8 staff members with American Red Cross. Staff members will
  then be trainers for remainder of staff.
- Senior recognition Graduation cords will be given to C<sup>2</sup> Pipeline participants who have full time status in the program during their junior or senior school year will receive a solid green cord. Students who attend IPE will receive a green and gold cord.
- Digital Badges MDE will be using our summer programs to beta digital badges. We are waiting for MDE to revise the current rubric to determine how to weigh badges. We will be creating and administering badges for professionals for participation in C<sup>2</sup> events.

## Summer 2015 Report

- School of Business Team Update The winning team will be hosting summer camp at Warren Mott High School. One team had issues with their steering wheel design, but learned from their mistakes. The remaining teams are continuing to work on their projects. Saturday, March 26, all teams will meet at WSU.
- Student Admission Report Thirty students applied to WSU, twenty-seven were admitted and fourteen have committed.
- Pitch Night Teams will present to a group at Pharmacy on June 3. The event begins at 5 p.m. and ends at 8 p.m., dinner will be served at 5 p.m. Invitations will be sent out. The first place team will receive a scholarship from the School of Business.

- Day Program Refer to 2016 Summer Program Brochure. This year we will have camps at satellite locations along with camps on campus.
- Residential IPE Program
  - -Commercials C<sup>2</sup> schools are using these to recruit.
